# **Report of Commissioners:**

Chairman Albrecht asked when there would be more Lateral Police interviews. Police Chief Anderson stated Commander John Rice would best be able to answer that question. He stated that he believed the backgrounds would be completed by February 12<sup>th</sup> and that there would be interviews held shortly thereafter. All ten of the remaining Lateral candidates have been assigned to detectives to perform the background investigations. He noted that calls have been made to candidates and several have dropped already, potentially due to length of time. Police Chief Anderson noted this is not uncommon as candidates for lateral positions have often applied to multiple departments.

Chief Anderson also noted that in conversations with other police departments, there is a consensus that the structure of Des Plaines' Lateral Program, particularly its use of a candidate pool, is very well-structured and thought out. Once new hire testing begins in January, there will likely be another push for lateral candidates to replenish the pool. Deputy Chief Shanahan added that the department is currently down two officers, three counting the extra person added in the recent budget approval. There will be a retirement in January as well so there will likely be four vacancies. Police Chief Anderson noted that one Des Plaines officer recently transferred to Chicago as a lateral. Deputy Chief Shanahan noted that there have been some instances of lateral officers leaving Chicago and then returning to Chicago, potentially due to a slower pace in the suburbs whereas the City offers more districts and units to provide more variety.

Chairman Albrecht asked if there was any report from Fire. Deputy Chief Matzl stated they will be building a new list soon. There are four open positions and potentially a couple of retirements. The Fire test is already out and will close on December 13<sup>th</sup>.
